### Annual Governance Statement for Eltham Church of England Primary School Governing Body Autumn 2023

In accordance with the Government's requirement for all governing bodies, the three core strategic functions of the Governing Body are:

- 1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- 2. Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

#### Governance arrangements

The Eltham Church of England Primary School Governing Body is made up of:

Two parent governors

One local authority governor

Headteacher

One staff governor

Parish Priest

Six foundation governors selected by the PCC of St John's Eltham

Three foundation governors selected by the Southwark Diocesan Board of Education

One co-opted governor selected for their skills and expertise in particular fields

To contribute to effective governance and the success of the school, Governors are expected to:

- Enhance the work of the governing body to enable a strong focus on raising standards, so that every child achieves their potential
- Understand the school and its performance through
  - o reviewing data,
  - o monitoring impact of teaching on pupil outcomes,
  - o understanding the financial status of the school and the best use of its funds
  - understanding the challenges and National <u>Landscape</u> that the school faces internally and externally <u>including the changes in curriculum and population</u> make up and special educational needs of the school's pupils.
- Take personal responsibility for their ongoing training and development including safeguarding in line with KCSIE
- Attend meetings (governing body/working groups) and play an active part
- Prepare for meetings so they are well informed, having read all of the papers sent out with the agenda
- Recognise the corporate status of the governing body and the concept of collective responsibility
- Respect confidentiality and the need to act with circumspection. Governors are required to sign up to the Governors Code of Conduct each year.

The governing body has a programme of meetings throughout the school year with each Governor having a specific area of responsibility. Minutes of these meetings are available to be viewed in School.

# Attendance record of governors

A record is kept by the clerk to the governing body of governor's attendance at meetings, and published on the school's website. Governor's attendance at meetings is excellent.

## The work we have done in the governing body meetings

The work we have done in all meetings revolves around the school improvement plan. Our priorities for the academic year 20223/24 3-are:

- To work closely and effectively with the Head<u>t</u>+<u>T</u>eacher and all staff to ensure that teaching and learning is a strength and that pupils make good progress and achievement including vulnerable groups including through links on specific subjects.
- To become actively involved in the life of the school; visiting the classes to monitor teaching and learning of specific subjects and the delivery of the curriculum
- To ensure that the school remains financially sustainable.
- To ensure that the school is meeting Health & Safety, Safeguarding, Child Protection, Educational Visits and Premises procedures and requirements.

### We have done this by :-

- Ensuring the Headteacher has a robust appraisal and accountability schedule
- Supporting the school through link governor working with subject leaders on monitoring of quality
  of provision, the progress and attainment of all pupils and asking for evidence, including book
  examinations, monitoring reports, discussions with children and learning walks.
- Examining and challenging internal and external performance and progress data.
- Robust challenge and monitoring of staffing and financial management of the school
- Ensuring the judgement of the staff and Head <u>₹</u>Teacher are in line with local and national standards through external validation.
- Ensuring the individual needs of pupils are met, through interventions, by the scrutiny of data and regular visits by Governors new these can recommence.
- Ensuring that all safeguarding and child protection systems are robust, effective and well communicated

In addition we have undertaken our statutory duties with regard to:

- Performance management of the Head <u>\*T</u>eacher
- Reviewing and updating statutory policies
- Monitoring the effectiveness of pupil premium and sports funding

Governors have undertaken a variety of training at the Southwark Diocesan Board of Education, as well as Royal Borough of Greenwich on; Analysing School Performance, Ofsted inspection framework, Being a governor of a Faith school, safeguarding this includes an awarding of the Bishop's Certificate from the Diocese.

The minutes of the Governing beody are public documents which are available to view on request at the school office. They can only be published once they have been agreed as a 'true record' of the meeting at the next Governors meeting.

#### Strategic Planning for the future

Our aims for the forthcoming year:

- To be actively involved in the delivery of teaching and learning, giving insight into how individual subjects are action planned and delivered, thus hold the Headteacher and SLT to account for teaching and learning standards
- To maintain the school's <u>OFSTED rating of Outstanding Good</u> judgement with particular focus on the changes in inspection framework <u>and recommendations in the report.</u>
- To ensure that the school is in a financially stable position with regard to the increasing funding demands
