Message from Revd Caroline-

There is a beautiful passage in the Bible which starts... 'For every time there is a season' (Ecclesiastes 3. 1-8). I have been reflecting on this a lot as we draw this first term of the school year to a close.

It has been a hard season in many ways especially as we returned to school to the news of Chisimdi's sudden death over the holidays. He loved and he remains loved; and I thank you for gathering around his family in love and prayer and support. The outpouring of heartfelt messages; the attendance at his funeral; the collection taken in his name; each of these actions showed the depth of grief we felt and the depth of support for Chisimdi's family. The time for grief does not end quickly nor easily so please do get in touch if it would help to talk.

Amidst the grief, there has also been a season of generous giving. The donations collected at Harvest were desperately needed by the Food bank- a thank you letter (below) explains more. We collected food and hygiene items and restocked empty shelves. More importantly, though, we showed local people in need that they are not alone. That people do care and want to help.
