

Sports Premium at Eltham Church of England Primary School

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

At Eltham Church of England we currently spend over £18,000 to employ qualified sports coaches to deliver high quality sports, both in lessons and as after-school clubs. Since January 2013 we have added to this commitment and use the money allocated to the school via the 'Sports Premium' to enhance all PE lessons through staff INSET and training using high quality coaching and mentoring of all teachers in delivering PE.

- ✓ Tennis is offered to all children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6
- ✓ Children have the opportunity to use games and sporting equipment at lunchtimes.
- ✓ Children in EYFS attend Forest School.
- ✓ Where possible PE activities are achieved in cross curricular activities eg orienteering – moving around the school to find answers to quizzes, literacy activities in FS – make a letter shape with your body
- ✓ We have good links with our local secondary schools and are able to use their facilities where possible.
- ✓ We promote competitive sport outside of school and take part in as many inter school competitions as possible.
- ✓ Year 6 school journey which incorporates outdoor sports and activities.
- ✓ Children with SEN are included in all provision and their needs are met.
