 I can see blue and red organic forms creeping back the composition soft fish and drops of water. When I look at this artwork I feel like this alien shape is chasing me and taking over our world.

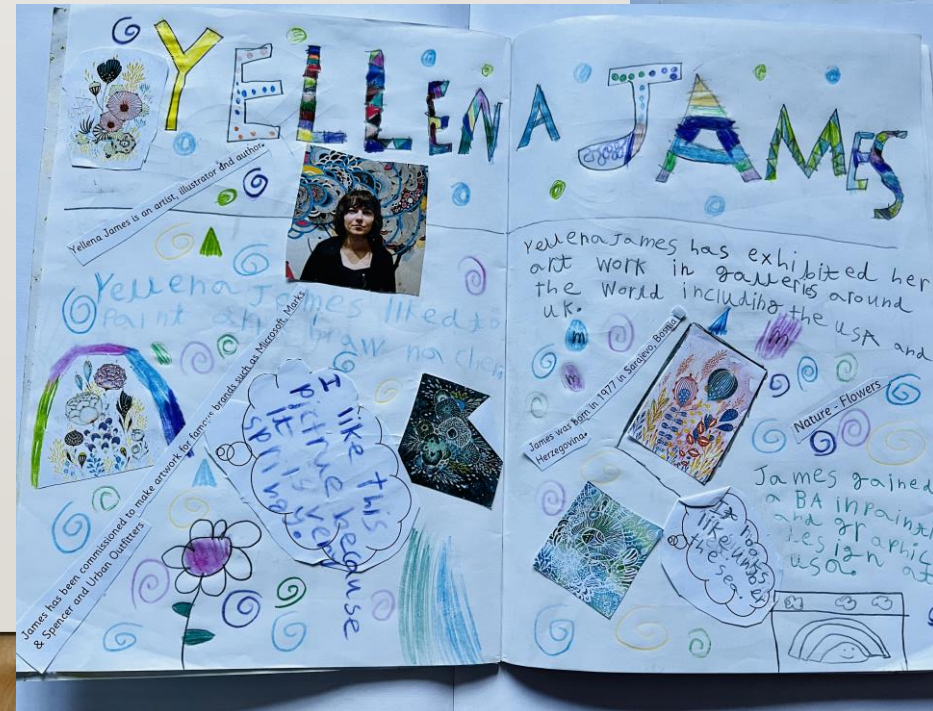
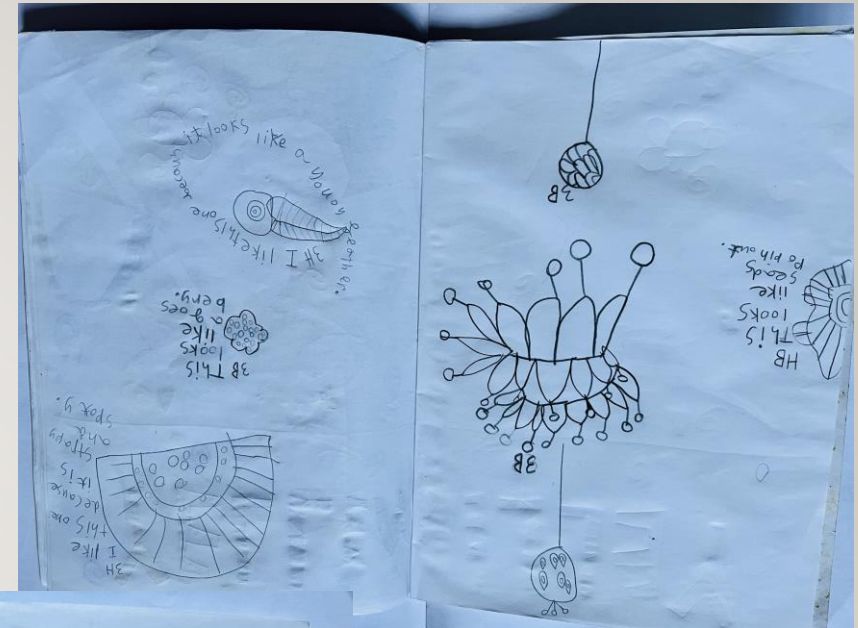
FACTS ABOUT HER THAT I FIND INTERESTING

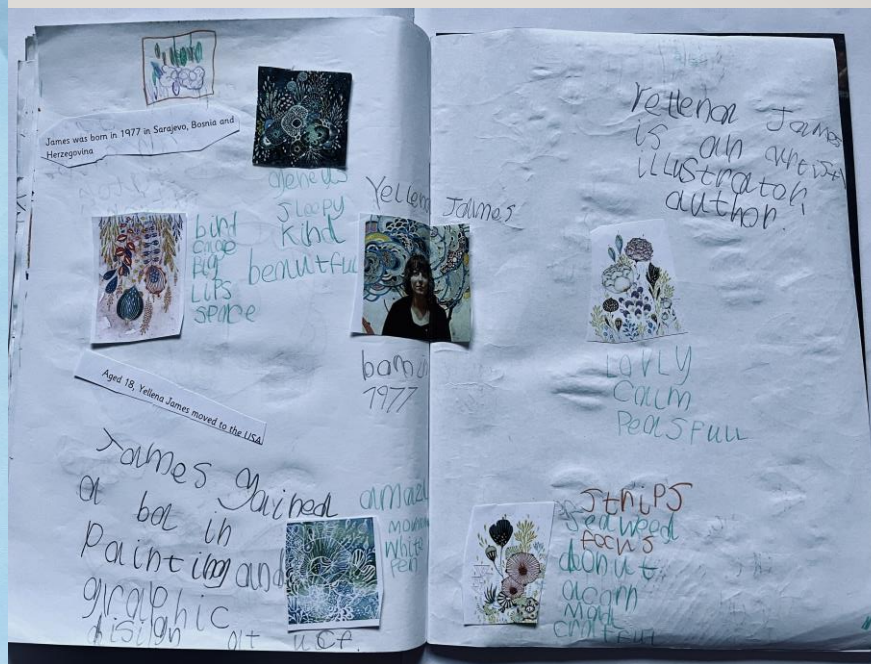
1. Happy childhood, until war broke out in her country.

 1984 - The miners strike - major event in British coal industry.

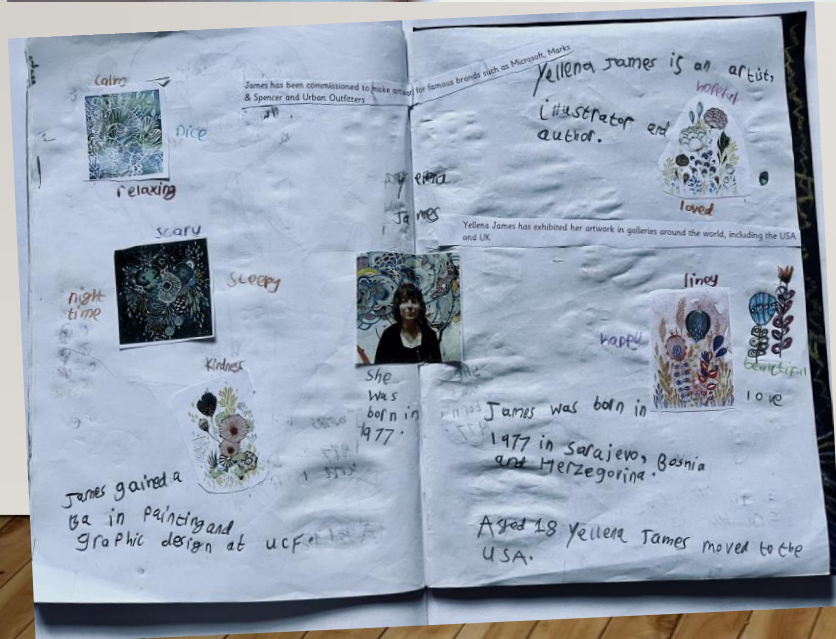

ARTIST STUDY

STEPHEN WILTSHIRE

Stephen was born in London United Kingdom on 24th of April 1974. He was born mute and could not speak and at Queen's School the teachers took away his art supplies and forced him to speak to get them back. His first word was 'paper' as he wanted to draw.

In January 2006, it was announced that Stephen was being named by Queen Elizabeth II as a member of the order of the British Empire in recognition of his services to the art world. Much of the time Wiltshire's work benefits or is in support of, a foundation or cause including art education for kids.

Self portrait

He completed a 2-year course in landscape painting and created a retro digital cartoon for his course work. Before all other students Stephen is also a regular guest at Apple's London flagship store to demonstrate his digital sketching skills at public events.

Norman Foster was born on the first of June 1935 in Manchester, England. This man was a son of a poor family, however he made his way up to Manchester University School of Architecture and city planning. He studied for 6 years. He also went to the U.S. to study at Yale where he spent 1 year. Foster stepped into the practical life by commencing an office collaboration with his wife in 1967. The firm now has 600 offices in about twenty countries today.

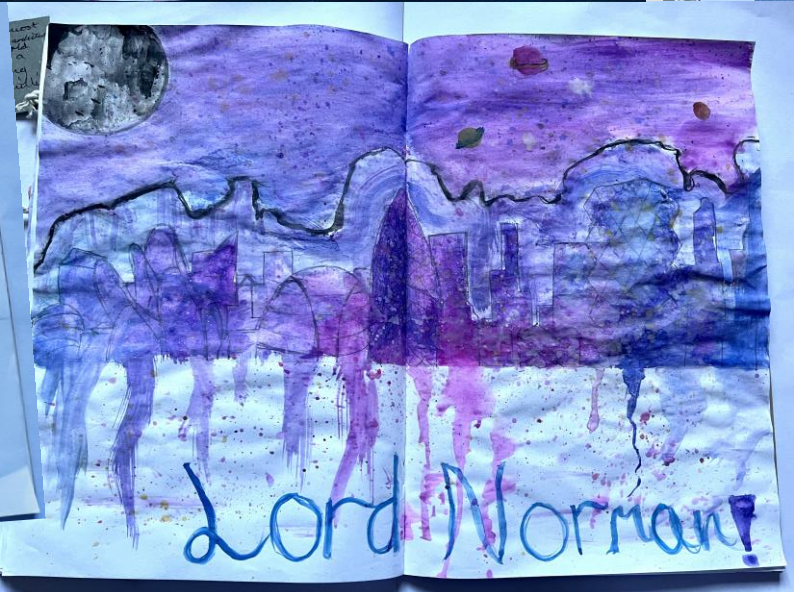
