Dear Parents and Carers,

End of Year Arrangements 2020

Following the Government's announcement last week with the intention to re-open school to all pupils from 1 September, it was clear that it is important to ensure that we have a planned closure to this school year, and transition into the next school year completed in July.

Therefore, there has been a change in arrangements for children so that we have an opportunity for **all pupils** to come into school **for one day** before term ends. They will have closure with their current teacher, and a chance to meet their new teacher in September.

This means that:

- Term will end for Year 6 and Nursery children **Friday 10 July**
- Children currently in Years 2, 3, 4 & 5 will have **one** day in school during the week 13th July
 - Monday 13 – **Year 2** and new Reception class visits
 - Tuesday 14 – **Year 5**
 - Wednesday 15 – **Year 4**
 - Thursday 16 – **Year 3**
- Children currently in **Year 1** and **Reception** are already in school and will have the opportunity to meet their new teachers on the morning of **Tuesday 14 July**. Children who are currently continuing to be at home are invited in for that morning (further information to follow)
- School will start at 9am and finish at 3:30pm for these year groups throughout the week.
- Entrance and exit will be via Archery Road

- **End of Term and school closed on Friday 17 July at 3:30pm**

This is a great opportunity for the school community to end this period of school closure in a positive and constructive way. Allowing the school to have a real and organised break and begin to prepare for September and a new school year. Specific information regarding these days will be coming out via your child's class email account. Please do look out for them.

Please note that guidance for the expected re-opening in September has not been published yet. But as before, as soon as it is I will meet with the Senior Leadership Team and publish the information to all parents as quickly as possible.
